



posted on a bulletin board in the airport administration offices and to send a copy to each tenant primarily affected. The public may submit written comments and proposed changes within 15 days. The ordinance also requires a public hearing within 30 days. Mr. Ramsey briefly discussed the revision history. The public comment period will be May 13, 2021 through May 28, 2021 and the public hearing will be held on June 14, 2021. Mr. Ramsey then discussed the May 2021 revisions made to the to the Airport Rules & Regulations.

In June 2019, staff was approached by a skydiving proponent about allowing skydiving at John C. Tune Airport (JWN). After conducting safety analysis, staff requested an evaluation from the FAA. The FAA determined that skydiving can be conducted safely at JWN. Parachuting is an FAA recognized aeronautical activity. Staff submitted a plan to integrate skydiving as an aeronautical activity at JWN by September 2021. Staff is now working with FAA headquarters to resolve additional concerns.

After questions and discussions, Mr. Ramsey concluded his presentation. This item was provided for informational purposes only with no action required.

B. JWN Redevelopment Update & Hangar Lottery

Ms. Traci Holton, VP, Chief Engineer and Deputy COO, gave an update on the construction at JWN. There was no change to the schedule and CGMP 3 of 4 will come before the Committee and Board in June 2021 for approval. Ms. Holton then discussed a few orientation differences in the layout due to grade issues. After questions and discussions, Ms. Holton concluded her presentation.

President Kreulen presented a layout of JWN and discussed future development opportunities in areas G, H and I. After questions and discussions, President Kreulen concluded his presentation.

Mr. Jeff Roach, AVP, Executive Director of JWN, discussed the upcoming timeline of activities to be conducted. The hangar lottery will take place in August 2021. Mr. Roach then presented the recommended lottery process. Commissioner Joslin commented he thought the recommendation was fair. After questions and discussions, Mr. Roach concluded his presentation.
