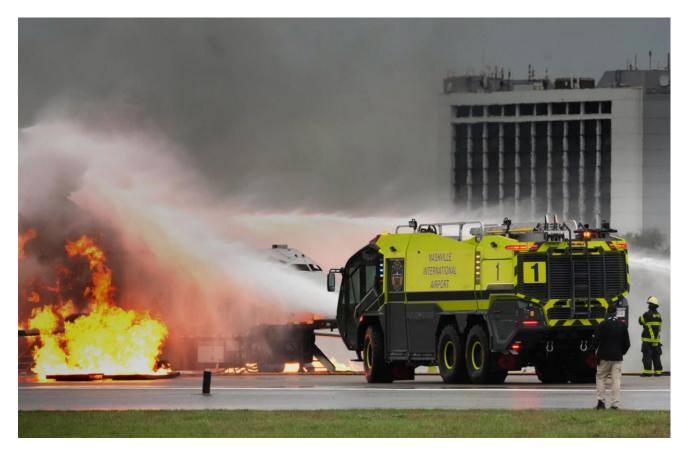

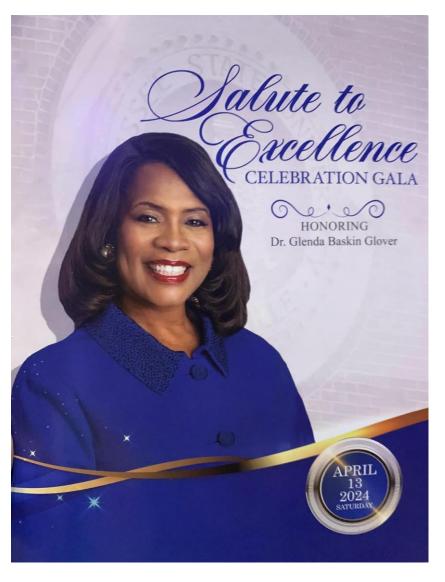

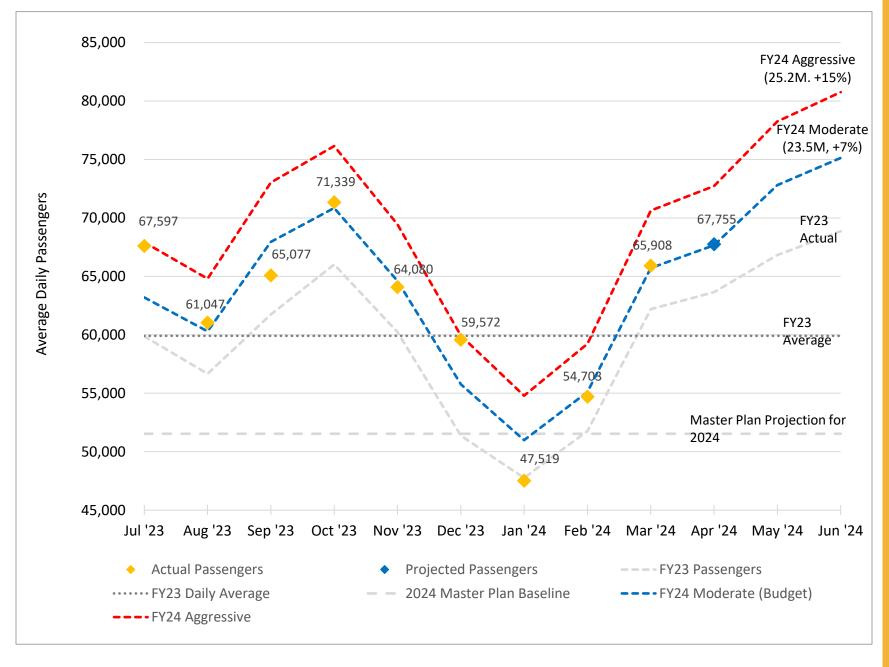

WREYER, WILLIAM "BILL" H. FREEMAN was first appointed to the Metropolitan Nashville Airport Authority (MNAA) Board of Commissioners by Mayor Megan Barry in January 2016, reappointed by Mayor John Cooper in April 2020 and reappointed by Mayor Freddie O'Conselli in December 2023 and

Fixerax, COMMISSIONER FREEMAN was elected unanimously to serve as Chair of the Board of Commissioners in August 2021, having previously been elected as Secretary, and was recognised and honored by his fellow Commissioners who approved his serving as Chair of the General Avistion, Operations, Planning and Engineering ("GADPE") Committee; Chair of the Management Committee; Vice Chair of the Finance, Administration and Properties ("FAP") Committee; and member of the Audit Committee, Diversity Committee, and Executive Steeping Committee; and

Fixeraz, during COMMISSIONER FREEMAN's tenure, BNA experienced extraordinary growth, including reaching more than 22.8 million passengers in 2023; exceeding 510 billion in annual Economic Impact to the region; and surpassing 5220 million in dedicated spending with Small, Minority- and Woman-owned and Osadrantaged Business Entreprises; and

Fixeraz, during his tenure on the Board, COMMISSIONER FREEMAN contributed to the approval, launch and completion of the unprecedented \$1.5 billion expansion and removation program known as BNA Vision*, designed to accommodate the record-breaking growth occurring year-after-year, and demantically transforming Nashville International Airport with a Ground Transportation Center, two Parking Garages, Administration Building, Concourse 0, Grand Lobby, International Airport Science (Science Concourse, Hilton BNA and Terminal Access Readway Improvements; and

Fixerezz, COMMISSIONER FREEMAN contributed to the approval and launch of the next 51.5 billion expansion and renovation program known as New Horizon, designed to accommodate 35 million passengers, including a Concourse D Stension, new Concourse A, Buggage and Handling System Expansion and Improvements, future Air Freight Building, and Terminal Access Roadway Improvements; and

Whereaz, COMMISSIONER FREEMAN positioned BNA for the future with the approval of the Terminal II String Study, a comprehensive analysis to determine the location of the second terminal, future CONRAC, and supporting roads, parking, transit, fuel and utilities; and

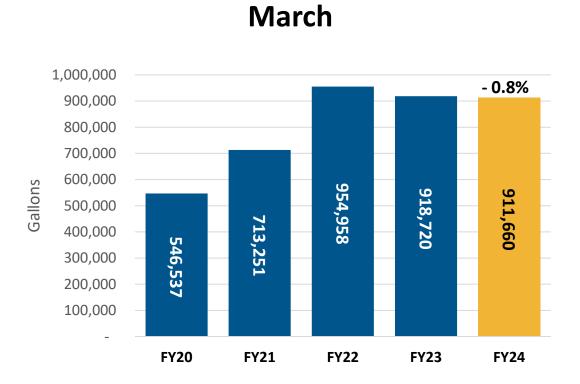
BNA Total Passengers



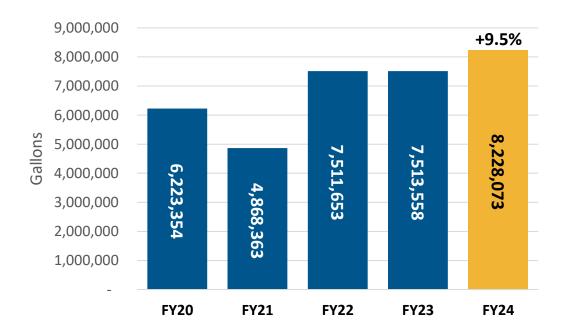
Fiscal Year to Date



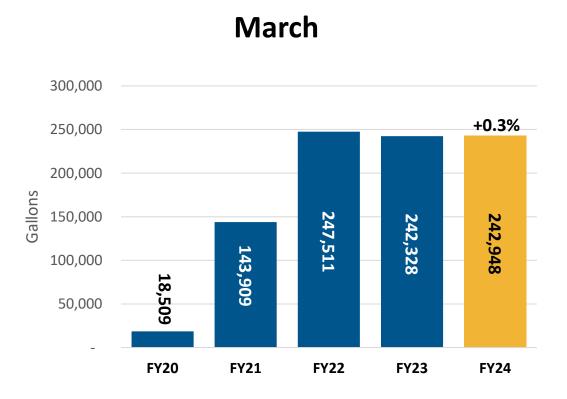
BNA Fuel Sales



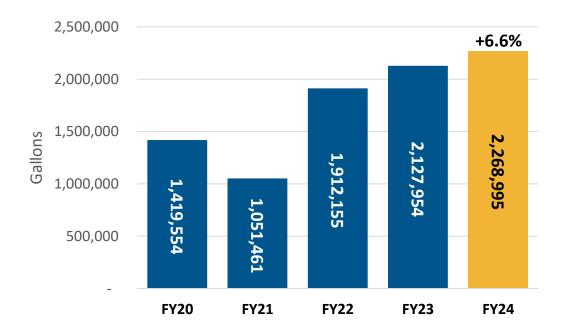

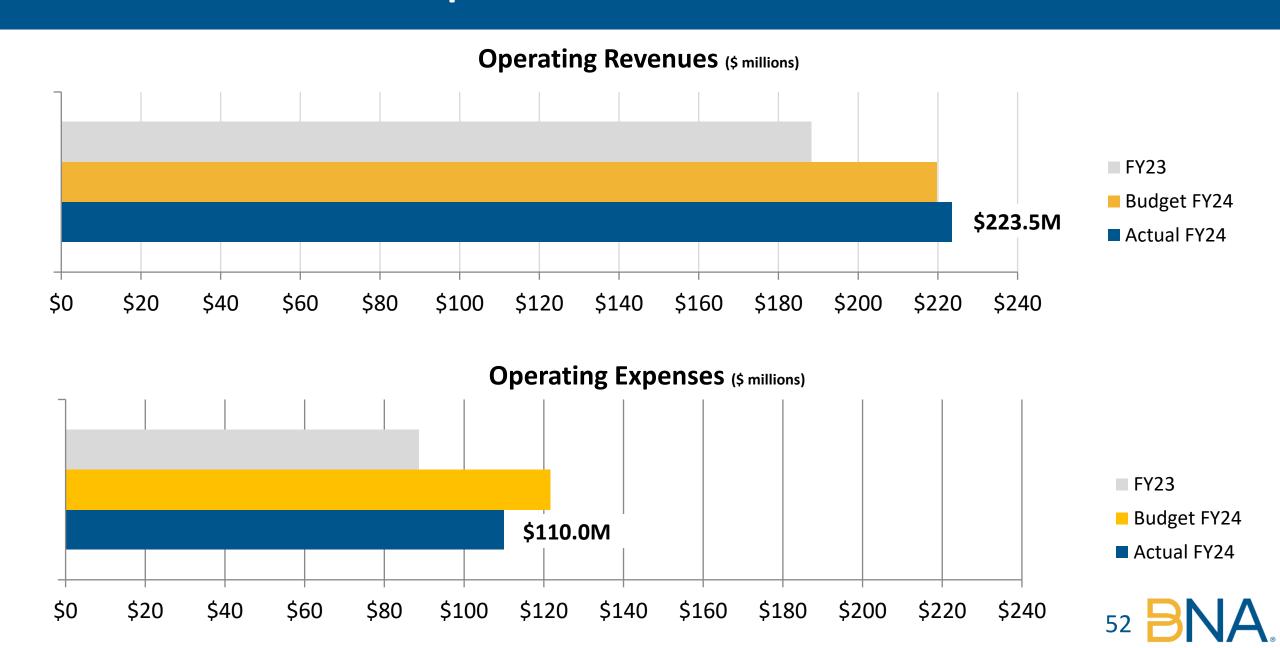

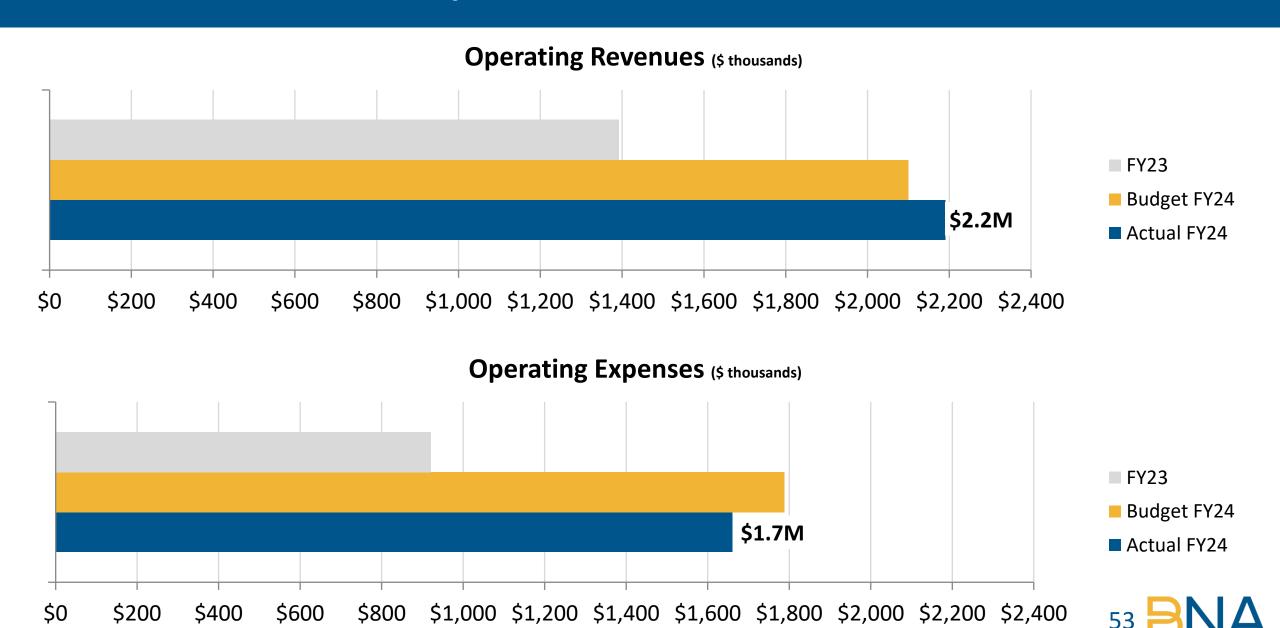

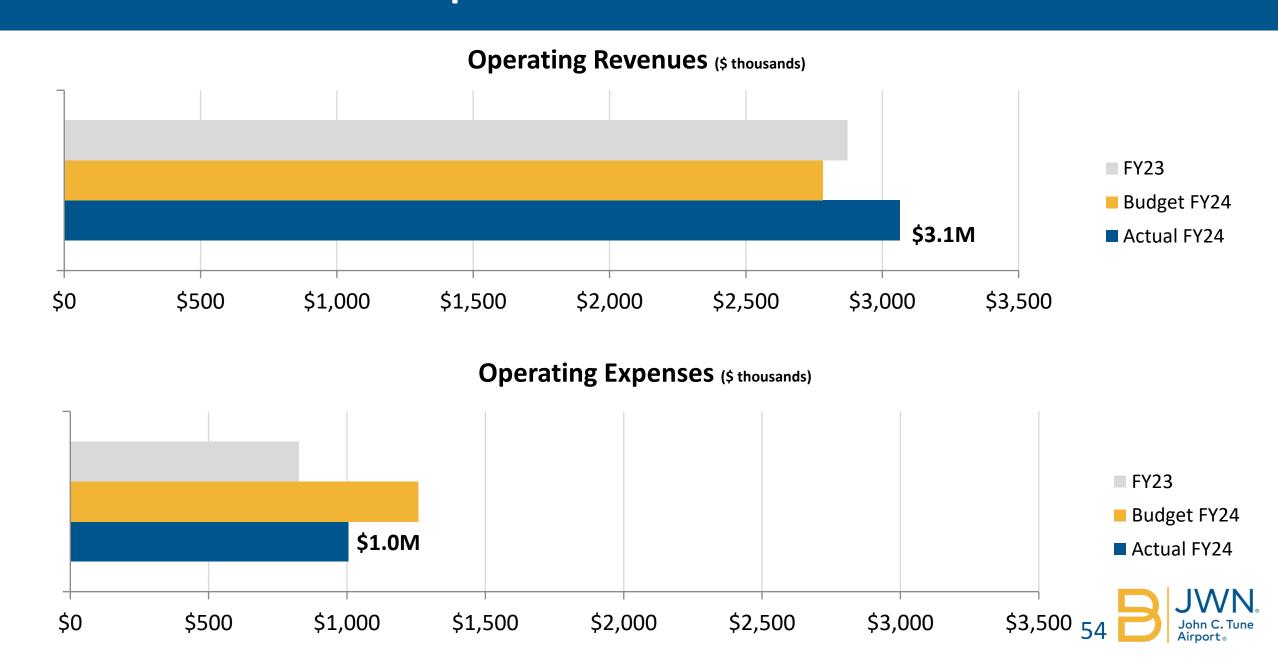
BNA – Revenues and Expenses YTD March 2024

MPC – Revenues and Expenses YTD March 2024

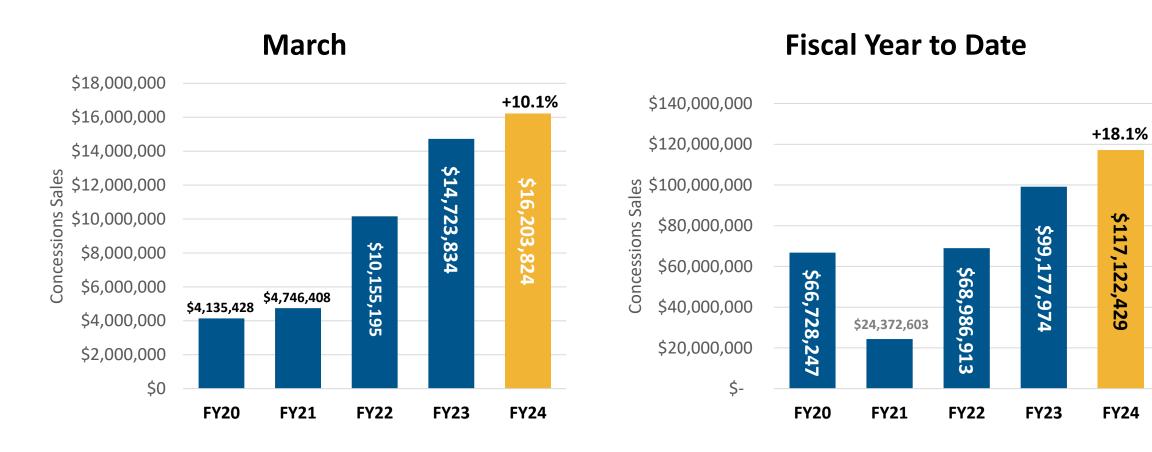
