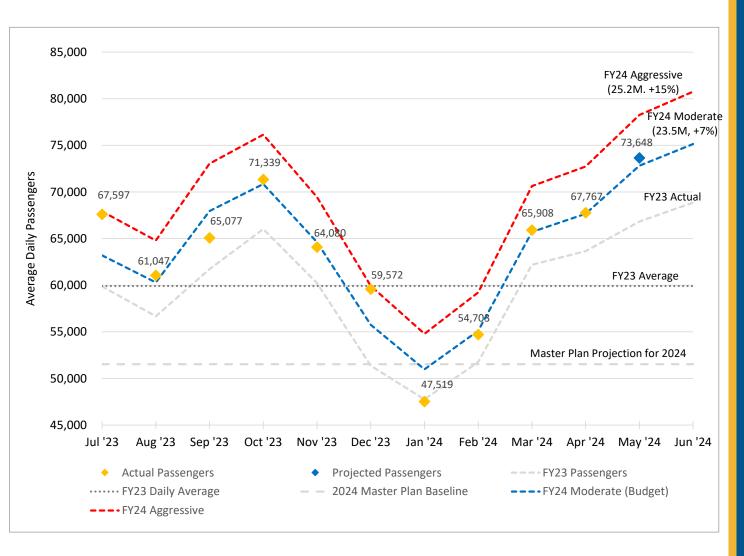




Dr. Glover Gifted 600 Graduates with \$50

Construction Contract for MNPD Hangar at John C. Tune Airport

Project Description: The project consists of the construction of an aircraft (helicopter) hangar and associated concrete aircraft apron

for use by the Metropolitan Nashville Police Department (MNPD) at the John C. Tune Airport.

Contractor: Baron Construction, LLC

Total Contract Cost: \$10,412,000

Schedule: Contract Start: June 2024

Contract End: March 2025

SMWBE: Goal = 10.08% MBE and 4.03% WBE; Commitment = 10.5% MBE and 4.07% WBE

<u>Committee Review:</u> Operations Committee voted 3 to 0 to recommend approval on May 8, 2024.

Staff Recommendation: Board of Commissioners authorize the Chair and President and CEO to execute the proposed contract with Baron Construction, LLC. in the amount of \$10,412,000.

Construction Contract for Cargo Apron Slab Replacement, Ph 8 of 22

<u>Project Description:</u> The Cargo Apron Slab Replacement, improving the Runway Safety Area, consists of full depth reconstruction

of broken and shattered concrete slabs on the north cargo apron, formerly the main airport terminal apron.

Schedule 3 includes approximately 5,200 SY of concrete replacement in three areas.

First Amendment to MNPD Lease Agreement

Background:

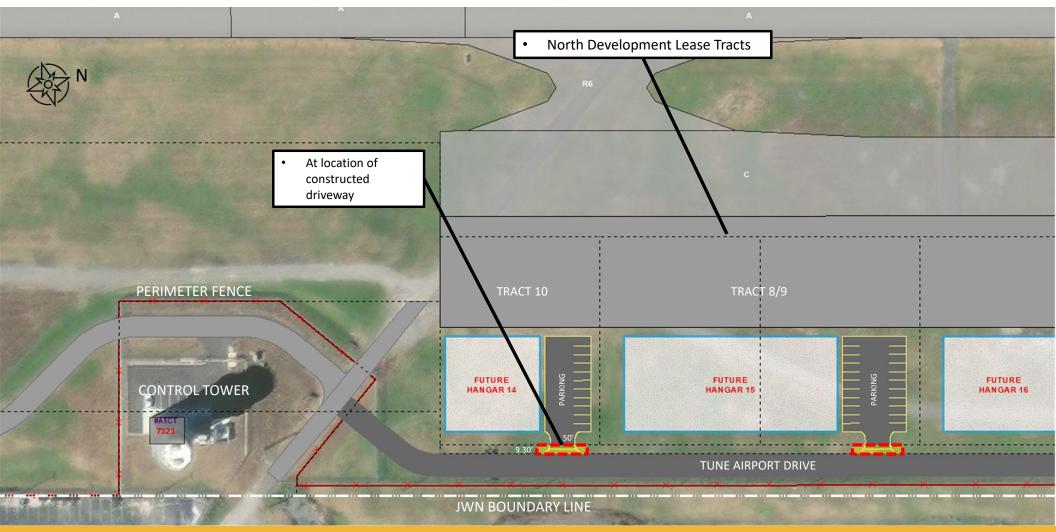
- Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County ("Metro") & Authority entered into Lease on Dec. 22, 2022.
 - Authority responsible for design & construction of a hangar for Metropolitan Nashville Police Department ("MNPD").
 - Metro responsible for reimbursing Authority for the cost of the design & construction through Supplemental Rent.
- Metro has the right to terminate the Lease within 60 days from the date they were notified of the Supplemental Rent.
 - No later than June 23, 2024

Property Description:

0.84 acres or 36,624 square feet of unimproved land at JWN (parcel 10)

Key Amendment Terms:

- 1) Effective Date: July 1, 2024
- 2) Supplemental Rent: \$66,746.54 monthly (\$800,958.48 annually)
- 3) Water Submeter Added: Will be installed to measure / invoice the consumption of water by MNPD.
- 4) Easement Granted: Authority grants Metro access in, to, and across the drainage culvert located between the access road known as Tune Airport Drive and the Premises, for the purpose of vehicular access for ingress and egress to and from the Premises.



First Amendment to MNPD Lease Agreement

Impact:

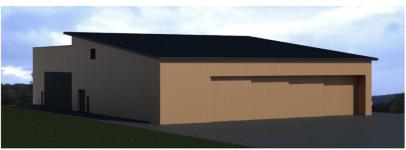
- Ground rent remains \$83,367 annually (annual escalation)
- Supplemental rent begins July 1st at \$800,958.48 annually for payback of design and construction of hangar
- New assets will vest in approximately 29 years

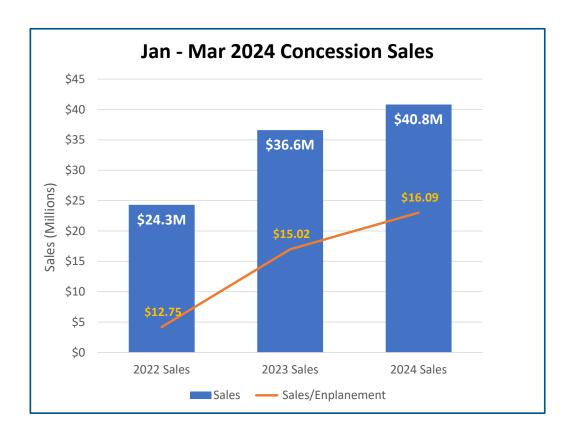

BNA Total Passengers

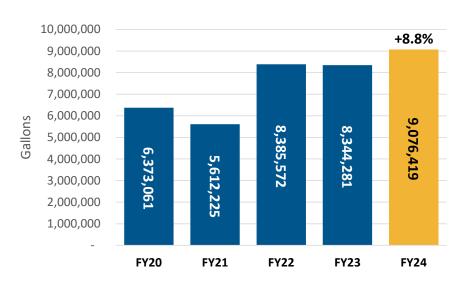

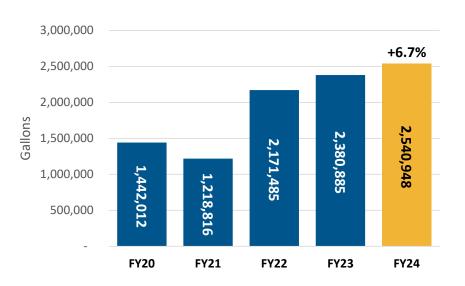

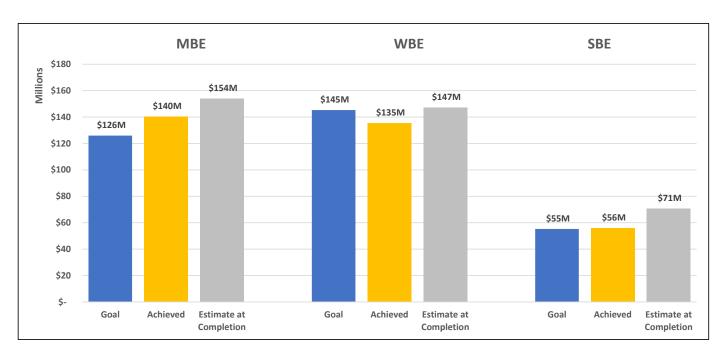

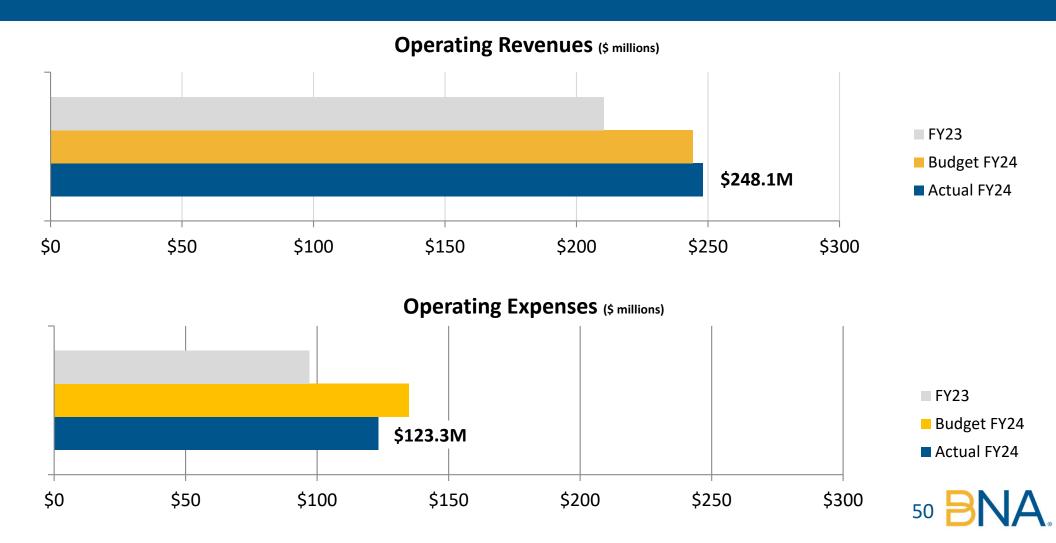

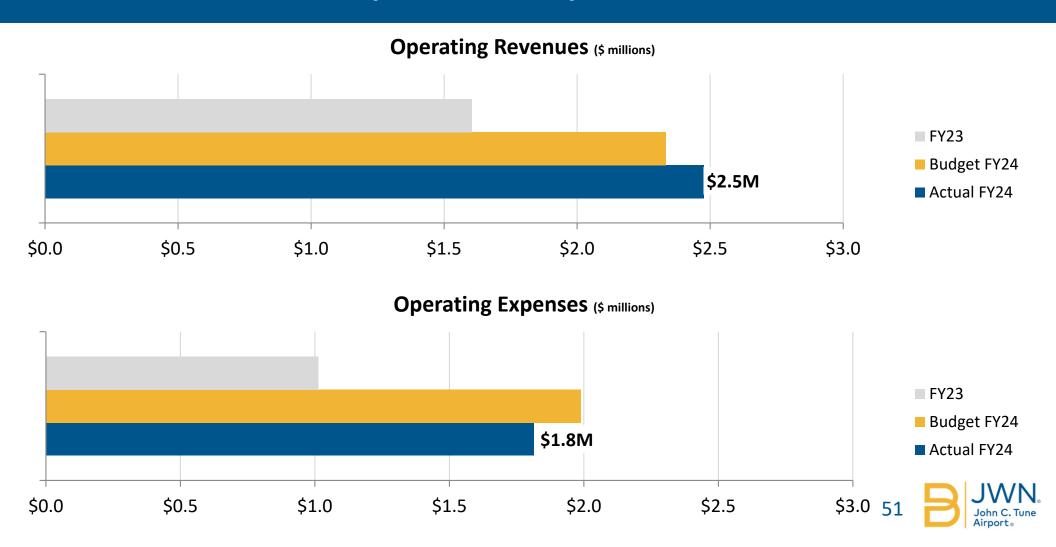

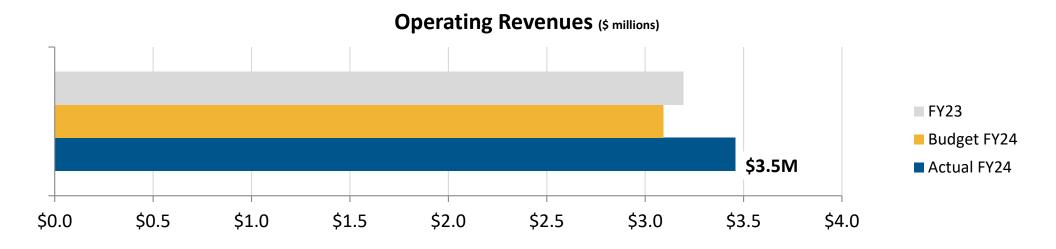
BNA – Revenues and Expenses YTD April 2024

MPC – Revenues and Expenses YTD April 2024



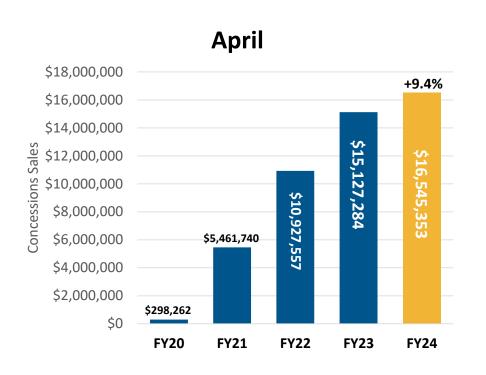




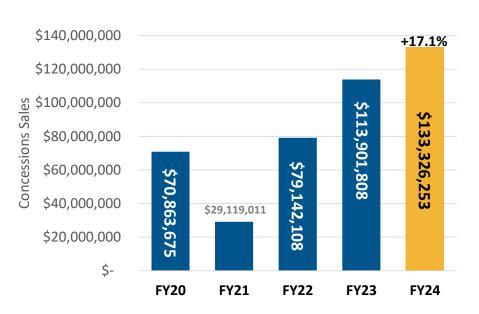
