## Art Selection for Concourse D Circular Node

#### **Overview of Location**

- The terrazzo floor art is a circular floor space in the middle of a round area that is to be designed by the designated artist.
- The location is entered from a central axis and surrounded by hold room seating with carpeted flooring.
- The edge of this circular node space gives close to 360-degree views of parked aircraft, the BNA airfield and surrounding scenery.





### **Retirement Plan & OPEB Funding**






Actual Funding
