Contract Renewal for Radio Communication Services

<u>Project Description:</u> Approve the Service Agreement with Motorola Solutions to provide maintenance and support for MNAA's radio system. The Service Agreement provides maintenance and support for hundreds of MNAA radios used to communicate and manage the day-to-day business of the Airport across Airport Operations, Maintenance, the Airport Communications Center, and the Department of Public Safety.



Art Selection for Concourse D Circular Node

Overview of Location

- The terrazzo floor art is a circular floor space in the middle of a round area that is to be designed by the designated artist.
- This art location is entered from a central axis and surrounded by hold room seating with carpeted flooring.
- The edge of this circular node space gives close to 360-degree views of parked aircraft, the BNA airfield and surrounding scenery.





Art Selection for Concourse D Connector

Overview of Location

- The public artwork is integrated into six expansive wall sections that bridge the existing concourse to the new Concourse D Extension.
- Considerations include proximity to the public traveling along the moving walkway, various points of view from the concourse as well as the tarmac, and the length of the artwork zone.

New Horizon I Program Scope and Budget

- October 2021: New Horizon concept introduced to Board
- November 2021 May 2022: Holder/Corgan conducted program development study and estimated the program to at \$1.462B. Landrum & Brown determined the program was generally affordable with Series 2024 & 2026 Bonds
- November 2022 October 2023
 - Baggage Handling System Expansion design-build; Concourse D Extension design-build; Concourse A design; and TARI Phase 2 approved by Board
- October 2023 June 2024: Additional projects identified
 - Central Ramp Expansion
 - CONRAC
 - Other facilities, land and roadway requirements
- June 2024: Decision to split New Horizon into 2 programs
 - New Horizon I (airside)
 - New Horizon II (landside)
 - 3rd program for Future MNAA Campus Requirements (in development)
 - Terminal II (phased)

BNA Development Update: Concourse A Design

- Opens July 3, 2028
 - Existing Concourse A closes for demo July 3, 2025
- Adds sixteen gates
 - 14 group III, 2 group V
 - Common Use Boarding at all gates
- Two 120' moving walkways
- Increases facilities by 400K sq ft
 - 1 additional baggage claim device
 - 24 additional ticket counters
 - 28K sq ft concessions space
- Unique finishes in tune with Terminal and Concourse D
- Additional Amenities
 - Larger & more efficient restrooms
 - Mother's Room; Service Animal Relief Area
 - Departures Level Outdoor Terrace
 - Mezzanine Airline Lounges (20K sf total)
 w/outdoor terrace & indoor balcony
- Central Utility Plant
