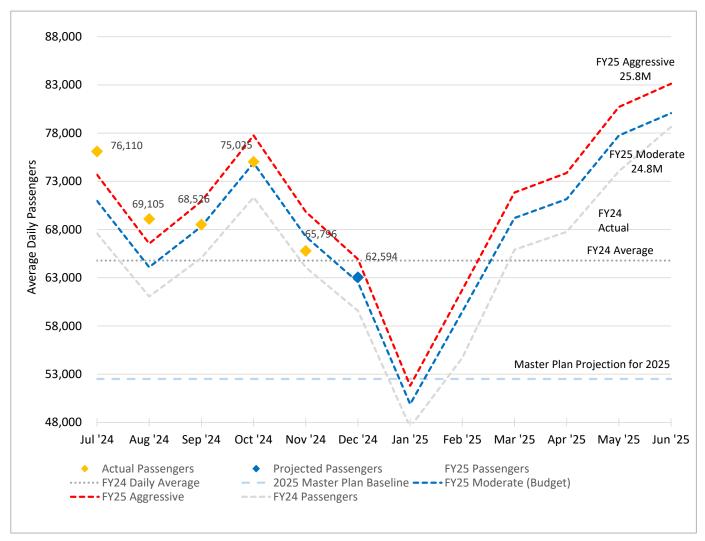

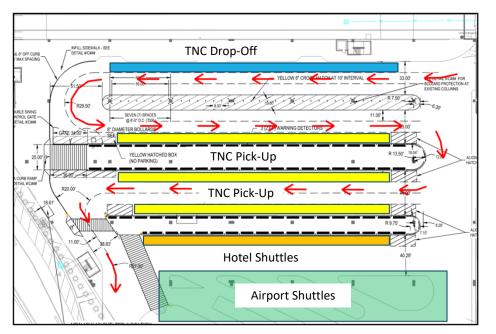

Service Contract for Common Use System

<u>Contract Description</u>: Service contract to provide a Common Use Systems at BNA for ticketing and gate boarding operations to include software, hardware, management, and maintenance.

- **<u>Contractor</u>**: AeroCloud Systems Ltd.
- **Contract Cost:** Year 1: \$ 696,248 (\$307,521 plus one-time setup fee of \$388,727)

Tenth Amendment to Fraport Lease & Concession Agreement

Background:

- MNAA has a Lease and Concession Agreement (Agreement) with Fraport, Tennessee, Inc. (Fraport) to develop and operate terminal-wide concessions program, including food, beverage, services, retail and vending offerings.
- The term of the agreement commenced on February 1, 2019, and will expire on January 31, 2029.
- Fraport has requested modifications to certain operating provisions of the Agreement to ease operating costs for concession tenants.

Proposed Amendment and Justification:

- 1) Amend concession pricing to allow prices comparable to street prices plus up to ten percent
 - Allows concession tenants to recover higher airport operating costs
 - Aligns BNA with most U.S. airports
- Amend concession operating hours requiring tenants to remain open until the last scheduled departure from their respective concourse
 - Requiring all tenants to remain open until the last actual departure in the entire terminal results in higher operating costs and impacts employee retention
 - NOTE: Tenants may be required to remain open beyond the last scheduled departure when needed to provide service due to flight delays

Staff Recommendation: Board of Commissioners accept the 10th Amendment to the Fraport Agreement and authorize the Chair and President & CEO to execute the Amendment.



Second Amendment to Paradies Lease & Concession Agreement

Background:

- MNAA has a Lease and Concession Agreement (Agreement) with Paradies-Lagardere@Nashville, LLC (Paradies) to develop and operate a concessions program in the Satellite Concourse.
- The term of the agreement commenced on October 19, 2023, and will expire on October 18, 2033.

Proposed Amendment and Justification:

- Amend concession pricing to allow prices comparable to street prices plus up to ten percent
 - Allows concession tenants to recover higher airport operating costs
 - Aligns BNA with most U.S. airports
 - Aligns concession pricing provisions with those in the 10th Amendment to the Fraport Agreement

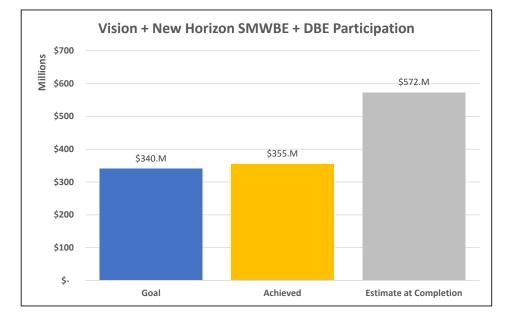

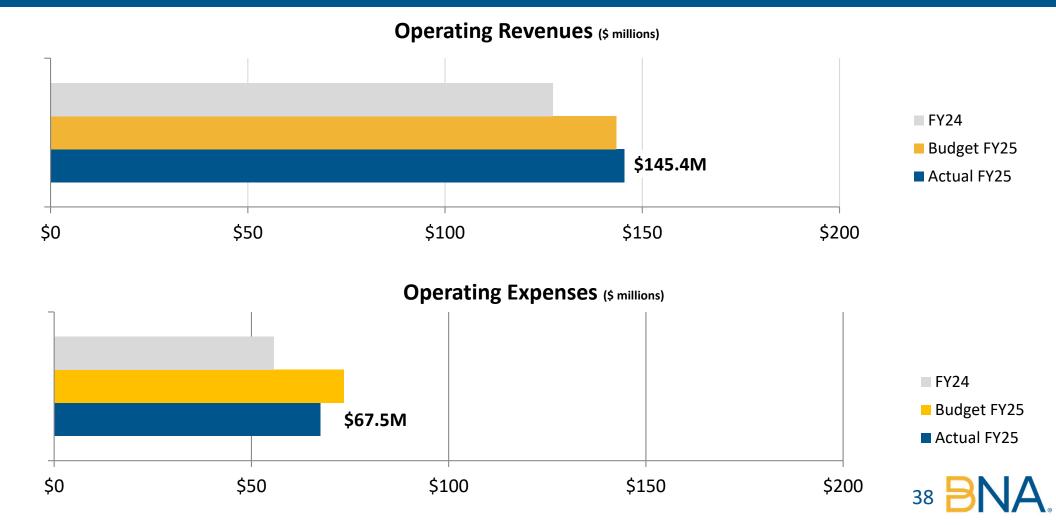

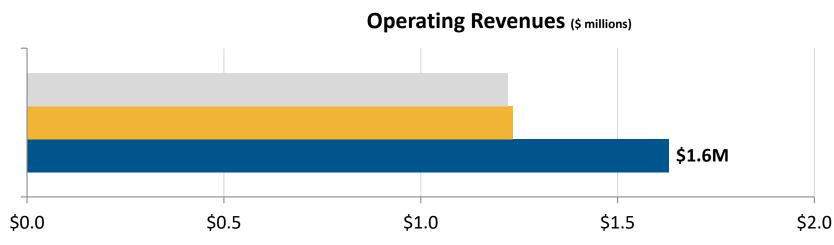

JWN – Revenues and Expenses YTD November 2024

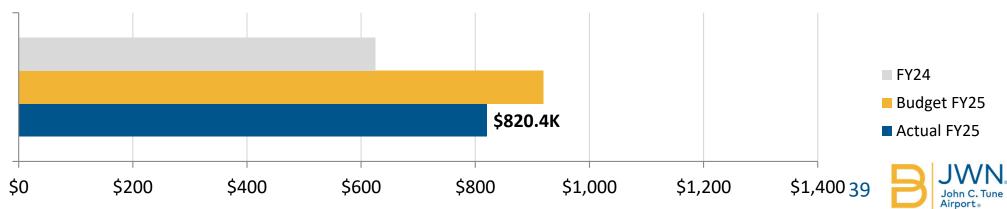

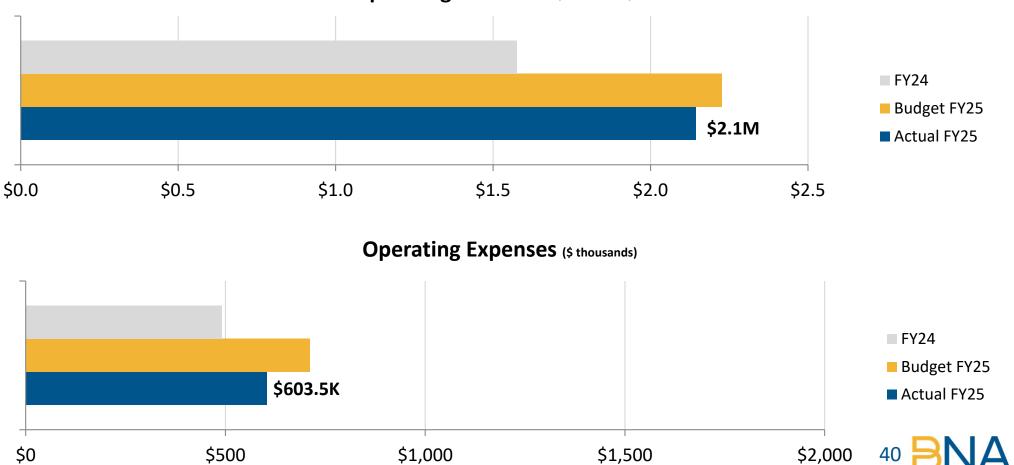

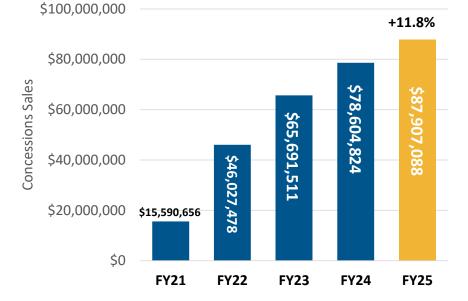
