BNA Total Passengers

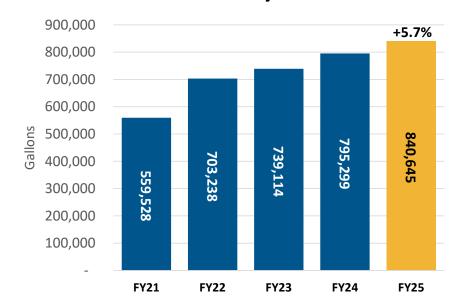

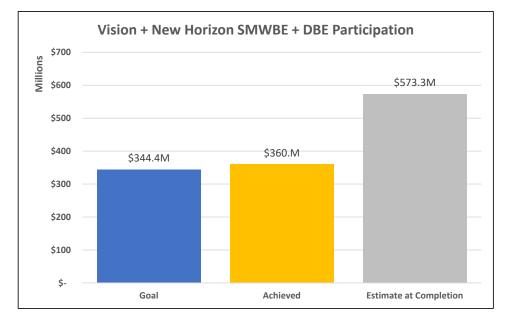

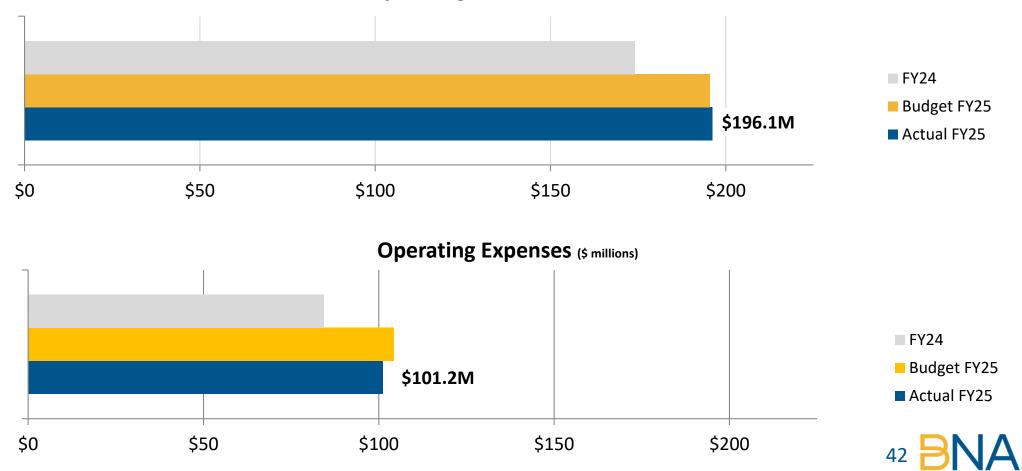

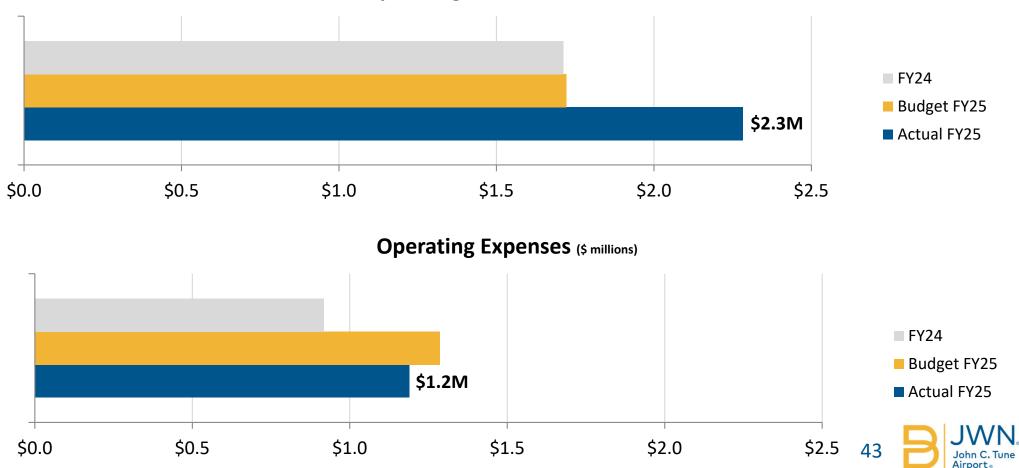
BNA – Revenues and Expenses YTD January 2025

Operating Revenues (\$ millions)

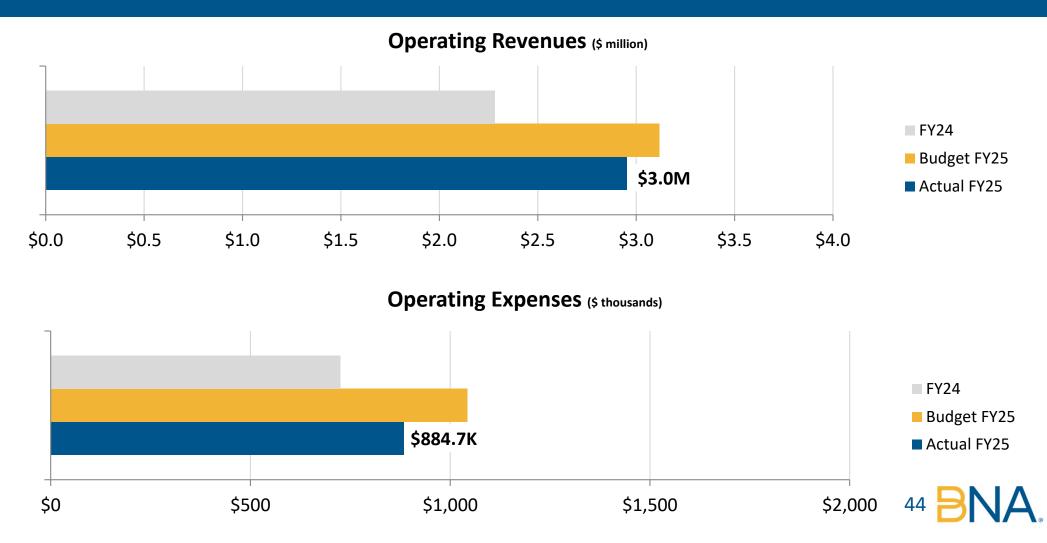


JWN – Revenues and Expenses YTD January 2025

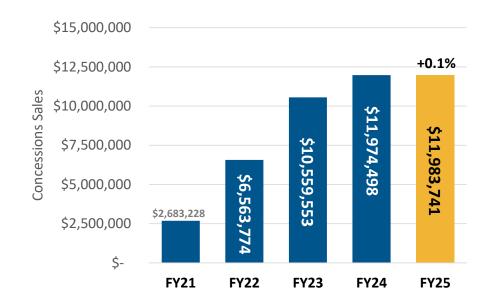
