#### OCIP Program and Builder's Risk Insurance Coverage

- Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP): Includes 3<sup>rd</sup> party liability insurance and contains coverage against contractual liability, personal injury liability and property damage
- Builder's Risk Insurance: Protects owners and contractors in the event of direct physical loss or damage to a project
- Total Contract Costs: \$16,368,025 OCIP (\$1.6B proposed projects; 1% contract value)

#### **Contract for Stop Loss (Health Insurance) Insurance Coverage**

- **Stop Loss Insurance:** type of coverage primarily used by self-funded plans to protect an employer against unexpectedly high claims and limits their liability for health care costs. MNAA's insurance coverage is considered a self-funded plan and purchases a stop loss policy for medical costs exceeding \$200,000 per participant.
- Estimated Premium: \$ 192,721 NTE Single Coverage (218 estimated employees @ \$73.67 per month)
  - \$ 990,392 NTE Family Coverage (371 estimated employees @ \$222.46 per month)
  - \$ 1,185,000 NTE Estimated Total Premium (Rounded)
- <u>Funding Source</u>: Operating budget for active employees and OPEB (Other Post Employment Benefit) trust for pre-65 retirees.
- Committee Review: Finance Committee voted 2 to 0 to recommend approval on December 10, 2025.
- **Staff Recommendation:** Staff recommends the Board of Commissioners:
  - 1) Approve the Stop Loss Insurance Coverage for calendar year 2026 at \$1,185,000 NTE, and
  - 2) Authorize the President and CEO to execute the Stop Loss policy with Symetra.

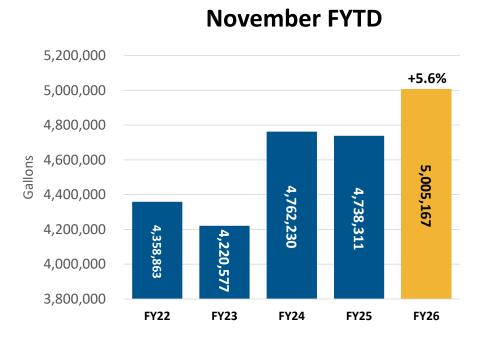
#### **BNA Total Passengers**

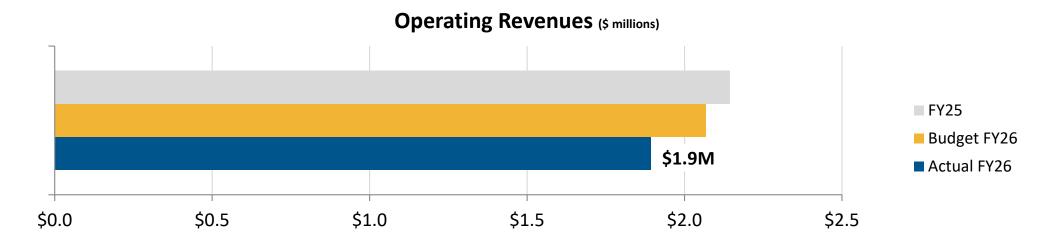
#### **BNA – Revenues and Expenses YTD November 2025**



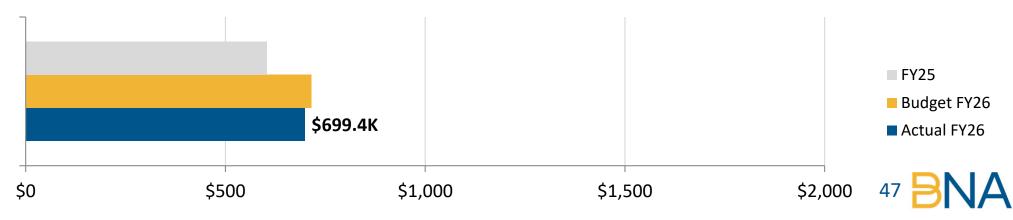
#### JWN – Revenues and Expenses YTD November 2025



#### MPC – Revenues and Expenses YTD November 2025





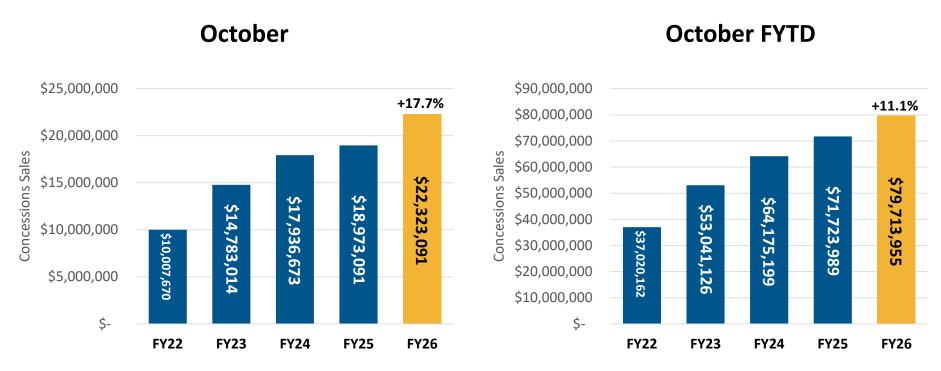
